

New GAA Code of Behaviour

On the 27th of November, the GAA launched a revised Code of Behaviour (Underage), which is mandatory for all Gaelic Games Associations in our work with underage players. The Code of Behaviour (Underage) is now solely an online document (see link below)

Some key sections of the Code are Child Safeguarding Risk Assessment & Child Safeguarding Statement, Maintaining Good Practice and Behaviour, Dealing with a Breach of the Code, Club Children's Officer and Designated Liaison Person. New supervision ratios are also highlighted in section 5 and appendix 12.
