GROUND REGULATIONS

1. All persons entering this ground are admitted only subject to the following Ground Regulations and to the Rules and Regulations of the Gaelic Athletic Association. Entry to the ground shall be deemed to constitute unqualified acceptance of all these Rules and Regulations.

2. Fireworks, smoke canister, bottles, glasses, cans, flags, banners, poles, air horns and other similar articles or containers, including anything which could or might be used as a weapon, are not permitted within the ground, and any person in possession of such an article or container may be refused entry. Should any flag cause an obstruction or present a risk to health & safety, due to the size or type of flagpole used, the GAA reserves the right to have that flagpole removed from the grounds. Flags other than the national flag, Association flag and the flags of competing teams should not be flown from flagpoles at our games.

3. The consumption of intoxicating liquor is permitted only in authorised places and spectators are not permitted to bring alcohol into the ground.

4. Smoking is permitted only in designated areas.

5. The authorised climbing of stands, seats or other buildings in the ground is forbidden.

GAA Minor Special Recognition Awards. These awards take into consideration the difficulties experienced by Minor players who have gone above and beyond in their communities during the challenges of Covid-19.

I would like to congratulate Donegal and Tyrone on reaching the 2021 Ulster Football final. Reaching a provincial final is a major achievement. Best of luck to both teams.

13. Patrons are not permitted to enter the field of play, before, during, or after the game.

MATCH PREVIEW



The 2021 Electric Ireland Ulster Minor Football Championship culminates this evening in Brewster Park with the meeting of Tyrone and Donegal in the Final.

Underage success has been consistent for Tyrone over the past few decades, and with 23 titles they top the Ulster Minor roll of honour. However, it has been a long nine years since they last won the Fr Murray Cup victory back in 2012.

Donegal meanwhile have been crowned champions twice in that time (2014,2016), and this evening they are chasing their eighth ever Ulster Minor crown.

The counties met in the 2020 Minor Quarter Final which took place in December, where Tyrone prevailed in a war of attrition in rain-soaked Ballybofey, 0-8 to 0-7.

Several players who started that day play again this evening; Michael Rafferty, Callan Kelly, Ruairi McHugh and Cormac Devlin represent Tyrone again, while Luke McGlynn remains for Donegal.

The young Red Hands, managed by Gerard Donnelly, have been in sumptuous scoring form in the previous rounds against Down and Fermanagh respectively, racking up 9-37 in their two games to date, and conceding just 1-15.

Team captain Devlin has led the attack from centre forward, but he has been ably assisted by Gavin Potter, Ronan Cassidy and Eoin McElholm in a potent Tyrone forward unit. Coalisland Fianna club man McHugh also combines scoring ability with ball winning skills at centrefield.

Donegal's path to the final has been markedly different, and a chequered one in itself. Having dispensed of Antrim in the first round with little fuss, they fought hard to overcome Monaghan and then Armagh in tight, tense encounters to take their place in this evening's decider.

Like Devlin for Tyrone, team captain and corner forward McGlynn is a key man for Donegal in the scoring department. The Glenfin man is reliable from placed balls, and his classy 55th minute goal against Armagh was the vital score that sealed their semi-final win last Friday.

McGlynn's clubmate Daniel Marley is a lively, creative player in the other corner, while Sean Ward and Conor Reid provide a strong and dynamic midfield foundation for the side. Naomh Columba man Michael Callaghan has also made telling contributions off the bench for Luke Barrett's side.

Tyrone's annihilation of their opponents to date has outlined the talent they possess in their ranks, but they will no doubt face a much sterner test today from the Tir Chonaill boys, who have shown in recent weeks the required grit and determination to come from behind and win their previous two games in the closing quarter. An intriguing encounter awaits.

CUP HISTORY

The Prize on Offer

Fr Larry Murray (1883-1941) is unique in that Provincial Championship Cups in both Ulster and Leinster are named after him. A native of Carlingford he was educated in St Patrick's College, Armagh and in Maynooth but was actually ordained a priest in St Paul, Minnesota, USA in 1910.

In 1918 he returned home, working his passage as a ship's stoker due to travel visa difficulties with the British Consulate in New York. Founder of the An tUltach magazine and Coláiste Bhríde at Rannafast he served as a priest in Louth and Tyrone and became a religious inspector of schools, all the while working tirelessly at promoting underage GAA and pursuing his other great passion, archaeology.

Fr Murray died aged just 58 in 1941 and in 1943 the Louth GAA County Committee purchased three Cups, each a replica of the Ardagh Chalice, in his honour. One went to the Louth Minor Football Championship and the other two to the Leinster and Ulster Minor Football Championships.

Oddly, the Ulster Fr Murray Cup went into storage for 40 years and was first presented to Derry's Dermot McNicholl in 1983. Up to then, Corn na Deoraidhe (The Exiles Cup) served as the Ulster MFC trophy. It now sits proudly in the Ulster GAA HQ in Armagh

WHAT Happens Next?

What happens next? That's the question everyone will be asking should today's game finish in a draw. If the teams finish level after normal time, the game will go to the standard extra-time of 2 periods of 10 minutes each way. Should that fail to produce a winner, then we move to a penalty shootout. The GAA's "Result on the Day" protocols were introduced in 2017, with a free-taking competition the method proposed for breaking the deadlock. That was subsequently changed to penalties.

So here is what happens next;

1. Well first thing first, only goals will count at this stage.

2. Each team will pick five penalty takers, a goalkeeper and a substitute goalkeeper. These are the only players who will take part until we find a winner.

3. All these players had to be on the field at the end of extra-time to take part (apart from the substitute goalkeeper, who can come from the panel and will only be used if the goalkeeper is injured during the penalties).

4. These players are registered with the referee along with the order the penalty takers will take their penalties.

5. Five penalties each, and whoever scores more wins the game.

6. If they're still level after five penalties, then there will be sudden death until we find a winner. The same five penalty takers must be used, though they don't have to be in the same order as before.
