Ground Regulations

- OI. All persons entering this ground are admitted only subject to the following Ground Regulations and to the Rules and regulations of Cumann Luthchcleas Gael. Entry to the ground shall be deemed to constitute unqualified acceptance of all these Rules and Regulations.
- 02. Fireworks, smoke canisters, gas- horns, bottles, glasses, cans, flags, banners, poles and other similar articles or containers, including anything which could or might be used as a weapon, are not permitted within the ground and any person in found to be in possession of such an article or container may be refused entry or ejected from the ground
- 03. The consumption of alcohol is not permitted within the ground and spectators are not permitted to bring alcohol into the ground.
- The unauthorized climbing of any structure, walls or buildings in this ground strictly forbidden.
- 05. Unnecessary noise from the use of radio sets, gas-horns and behaviour likely to cause confusion Of nuisance of any kind, including foul or abusive language, is not permitted in any part of the ground.
- 06. Under no circumstances is it permitted to throw any object the pitch.

- Unauthorised persons are not permitted to enter upon the field of play.
- Any person who fails to comply with the instruction from a Garda or Steward may be ejected from the ground.
- 09. In general, the right of admission is reserved to the Ground Management.
- The Ground Management reserves the right to refuse admission to or eject any person who refuses to be searched by a member of the Garda Siochana.
- Any person who remains in or obstructs a gangway or circulation area may be ejected from the ground.
- 12. The Ground Management reserve the right for it's servants or agents to remove from the ground any person who does not comply with the Ground Regulations or whose presence In the ground could reasonably be construed as constituting a source of danger, nuisance or annoyance to other spectators.
- 13. All persons in the grounds are reminded of their obligation under Section 18(3) of the Fire Services Act 1981 to ensure that their behaviour does not present a danger from fire to anyone using the grounds.



Second half comeback seals 7-in-a-row for Burt (by Damien Dowds)

Burt 3-17 Naomh Mura 3-9

The county final of 1997 was played at the Scarvey in Buncrana which had been recently developed and boasted an excellent playing surface. It pitted Burt against their parish rivals Naomh Mura for the sixth time in a county final.

Burt were gunning for a seventh straight title, but at half time that prospect looked bleak. Naomh Mura bossed the first half and

goals from John Gallagher and Joe Doherty (Bap) had them leading by 2-6 to 0-6 at the break. Barry Boyle and Peter McGonagle hit first half points for Naomh Mura while Burt's scores had come from the sticks of freetaker Andy Wallace and full forward Ray Durack.

There was no mincing words at half time and, to a man, the Burt players resolved that they would do whatever it took to ensure victory.

Their second half performance was as good as any half of hurling they ever played. They completely dominated every line of the field and outscored their opponents by 3-11 to 1-3.

Ray Durack started the rout with two goals soon after half time and Wallace's flawless freetaking continued as he fired over from every angle.

When Niall Campbell hit Burt's third goal in the 45th minute, the half time deficit of six had been turned into a seven point lead. Ardal McDermott and Seamus Craig were both sent off to leave the sides down to 14 men for the closing stages.

Barry Boyle kept tagging away at frees for Naomh Mura and when Joe Doherty hit his second goal the challengers got their second wind. Peter McGonagle drew a stunning save off keeper Martin Downey who shunted the sliotar onto the post and away from danger.



Having survived the let off, Burt pulled away in the last ten minutes hitting seven unanswered points through Mickey McCann, Wallace and Durack.

Burt were coasting when referee Aidan Skelton brought proceedings to an end. The final, played on Sunday 13 July, was Naomh Mura's last appearance in the county decider. The club, which had played at under-age level throughout the 1980s before becoming

a fully-fledged adult club in 1991, drew its players from Inch and Fahan.

The club was dissolved in 2001 and, in time, its members joined Burt.

Not alone are there links between the Burt team of 1997 and today (Fergal Grant and Mickey McCann are amongst the coaches), but there are links to the Naomh Mura team too.

Gerard Boyle was a young corner forward back in 1997, and today he's listed amongst the Burt substitutes. Donal Walker, the Naomh Mura wing back, is today the chairman of the Burt club. And corner back John McDermott is the father of Burt captain Caolan McDermott, and county captain, Ronan.

It is a measure of the growing strength in depth of both clubs that St Eunan's and Setanta are contesting this year's Donegal JHC on Friday night. And it could be a cracker, with a strong mix of youth and experience on both sides.

Setanta certainly have a real matchwinner in ex-county star Kevin Campbell who was the difference in his team's victory over Burt in the county semi-final. Campbell (36) is still one of the best freetakers in the county, and is also involved in his side's senior team management.

He is well supported by the likes of Ryan Coyle, Ryan Callaghan, Travis Lafferty, Pauric Moss and Tommy Lee Scully who are also subs on the senior team. Coyle must be very close to making a start on the Setanta senior side. That is a strong junior squad by any standards



and they also have Simon McMenamin and Gary McGettigan to call on.

Opponents St Eunan's can call on veterans like Eugene Organ to spur their chances. Organ came off injured in the semi-final and Eunan's

will be hoping he will be fully fit for the final. Colm Flood also togged out in an earlier game.

Stair - Naomh Ádhamhnáin

Bunaíodh Cumann Naomh Adhamhnáin i Leitir Ceanainn sa bhliain 1930. The black and amber jerseys have had great success over the years in Gaelic football, hurling, ladies football and camogie, winning senior championships in all codes. We have been Donegal senior football champions on 17 occasions (most recently 2021), senior hurling champions 9 times (2021), ladies football winners 13 times (2005, along with 4 Ulster titles between 1993 and 1998) and camogie champions 8 times (2000). Our club has had All Ireland football winners with Donegal in 1992 (Paul Carr, Charlie Mulgrew and Mark Crossan) and 2012 (Rory Kavanagh and Kevin Rafferty). Our underage teams have performed strongly in recent years winning numerous championships and leagues all codes.

After an absence of almost two decades hurling was restarted in St. Eunan's in the 1990s. We won the Donegal junior championship in 2000 and intermediate championship in 2001. The following year we made our first appearance in the senior hurling championship final since 1972, losing out to the great Burt team of that era. In this decade new young players from our juvenile teams have combined with our veterans to bring us to a new level. The main focus has been on juvenile development, with many years of hard work by dedicated coaches leading to county victories at various levels. Our teams are backboned by many dual players, a trend that can be seen in recent years in the most successful clubs nationwide. Our underage hurling successes brought us the point where we consistently challenged for the Donegal senior hurling championship.

After winning the Donegal senior hurling league for the first time, we finally became Donegal senior hurling champions in 2021. Our camogie coaches are continuing to develop their young players. Victories in numerous underage camogie championships led to our fielding at senior level again in 2020.

We are strongly represented on all county teams and our fine pitch at O'Donnell Park hosts many intercounty home games matches. Most Donegal hurling teams and many hurling and camogie championship finals are now played in Letterkenny. St. Eunan's players play major roles on our county's teams at all ages. It was a proud moment for us this year when Seán McVeigh captained Donegal to our Allianz National Hurling League Division 3A win, with many club colleagues by his side. Our young club players have been to the forefront of Donegal hurling teams playing in top level competitions lately. We look forward to contributing further to Donegal playing hurling at a high level.

MacCumhaills might just shade it

Preview from Gerry McLaughlin - Donegal Post

This curtain-raiser to the SHC final is between two very evenly matched sides indeed. The rise of Carndonagh in hurling circles over the past five years or so has been one of the hurling stories in the county. They won a JHC title in 2020 and have been making steady progress ever since becoming the third adult team on Inishowen.



They eventually overcame a strong challenge from Aodh Ruadh in a hard- fought final in a B pitch in Convoy.

Carn are powered mainly by the Doherty and Monagle families. Ex Donegal senior star Padraig is a staunch full-back while brother Cathal is a prolific scorer up front. But they can also call on county keeper Luke White at midfield and the powerful Danny and Paddy Monagle for strong back up. Wing forward Cian Doherty is also a potent attacker while new boy Jack McLaughlin is also a promising performer.

But they will face a stern task against a Sean MacCumhaill's side who won two senior county titles in the Noughties when current star Lee Hederson, the absent Ciaran Matthewson, Jamesie Donnelly and Paddy Hannigan were in their prime. Henderson is still a very big player for them and his accuracy from frees and

play is vital to the Twin Town side's chances.

They were too strong for Dungloe in the semifinal and can also call on the scoring power of P J Browne and the lively Jamie De Ward

But Anthony Patton is also a prolific goal scorer while John Chambers is another steady defender.

And while MacCumhaill's are not as powerful as they were a few short years ago, that full-forward line of Henderson, Browne and De Ward is capable of inflicting a lot of damage on Carn.

This could be very close also, but MacCumhail's might just shade it.

The Seán MacCumhaills GAA Club traces its lineage back over 100 years from a collection of smaller clubs in the vicinity of the Twin Towns of Ballybofey and Stranorlar. Both towns formed clubs of their own: Eire Ogs from Ballybofey in 1916 and Stranorlar Sarsfields in 1917.

club The was named after Seán MacCumhaill. His father was an engine driver at the Stranorlar Railway Station. Seán MacCumhaill suggested that both Eire Ogs and Stranorlar Sarsfields should amalgamate, and form one team called "Erin's Hope". Ben Griffin, former club chairman, and Seán MacCumhaill made an offer to buy a field which was within the town limits, and this is the current land we now retain.

In 1956 it was decided that the new ground would be known as Seán MacCumhaill Park and Erin's Hope also renamed to honour the work he did for Gaelic Games in the Twin Towns and his service for his country. The club would win its first Senior Championship in 1959. The club holds a proud history in all codes with 6 Senior Men's Championship titles, an intermediate title, and numerous

U21 successes along with Senior Hurling Championship triumphs in 2010 and 2016.

The club holds a proud history in all codes of GAA, Football, Hurling, Handball and LGFA. The club fields teams at every age group in both boys and girls football and continues to promote and advance hurling and camogie. We continue to focus on the development of our players and coaches, providing training in safeguarding, coaching, first aid and Health & Wellbeing initiatives which involve the whole community.

The most recent development has been the establishment of the hugely successful Academy which began in 2021, where children from the age of 4 have fun and learn the basics of football and hurling.

The club is one of the biggest in Donegal with close to 400 children as members and 300 adults. We have 29 Juvenile Teams, 95 Certified and Vetted Juvenile Coaches and Volunteers and players from Seán MacCumhaills are involved in Donegal Senior Football and Hurling teams, Donegal Minor Football, Donegal Minor Hurling, Donegal Development Teams and Donegal LGFA U14, U16 and minor grades.

Having won three senior hurling titles on the spin, before losing the final to St Eunan's last year, Setanta will rightly go into today's game against their old foes from Burt as favourites.

The likes of Danny Cullen, Declan Coulter, Barney Lafferty and Davin Flynn have been here before and

know what it takes to get over the line in games like these but according to Setanta coach, Kevin Campbell, the favourites tag will mean absolutely nothing when that ball is thrown in at 4pm this afternoon.

"Look at the All Ireland Final a couple of weeks ago, Limerick were expected to beat Kilkenny easy and there was a puc of the ball between them. We were seen as big favourites last year and St Eunan's turned us over and I remember in my first ever county final win, we beat a strongly fancied Burt team in 2007. None of that talk before a game means anything and for us, it will be all about matching that Burt intensity and then taking it from there."

Campbell also believes that with Donegal manager, Mickey McCann on the line, Burt could very well have an ace up their sleeve.

"The fact that Mickey McCann is back involved with Burt is something that should not be underestimated. Having played with and played under Mickey, I know all about what he brings and I know for a fact that Burt will be tactically well set up today. Mickey will look at individual match-ups because he knows so many of our players inside out, having



worked with them at county level and he'll have a system in place for puc outs.

"People can say that we are favourites for the game but that means absolutely nothing and we know that we are going to have to be at our very best if we are to get over the line."

Setanta cruised over the line against Buncrana in the semi-final without ever getting out of second gear, while for Burt, it was a case of coming through a real challenge against reigning champions St Eunan's and for star forward, Ronan McDermott who hit five points in that victory, the Hibernian Park men are going to have to go to another level again if they are going to repeat their success from four years ago when beating Setanta in the 2018 final.

"Setanta have a serious forward line that could do damage against any team and we know they have some very good stick men.

"If we're being totally honest, they probably have a stronger squad than we do but like in any final, it's all about what happens on the day and we have to believe that anything is possible. We'll all need to up our performance levels again from the semi-final and hopefully that should give us every chance against what is a very strong Setanta team."

This really does have the makings of a cracker and it would be no surprise to see the game being evenly balanced going down the straight. Put it this way, it would take a brave man to pick a winner.

A Year of Near Misses for Donegal County Hurlers Tom Comack - Iconic News

There were a lot of positives, despite two major dis-appointments, for Donegal senior hurlers in 2022. The year started out as it continued with some excellent performances but nothing to show at the end of it as Donegal went down to a single point defeat against Down in the Conor

McGurk Cup with the last puck of the game.

So near yet again for the county's caman wielders as they missed out on a crack at silverware and promotion in the league. It was a case of the neighbours taking the spoils when it counted in both the league and championship. Sligo were the party poppers in O'Donnell Park, when they came from behind late on to snatch a dramatic and narrow one point, to deny Donegal a 2B final meeting with Derry and a crack at promotion to Division 2A. Donegal led that game by six points at halftime thanks to a peach of a goal from corner forward Daire O'Maoleidigh and points from the hurling artist Davin Flynn. The Tipperary man scored ten points in the game.

A disappointed Donegal manager said after the game; "We played well in the first half and I felt we should have been nine or ten points up at half-time. We let them in for a couple of points before half-time and instead of being nine or ten up we were only up by six. We did not kick on in the second half and in fairness to Sligo we did not match them for hunger and they pipped us at the end."





Donegal had beaten Sligo by two points in the second round in Markievicz Park. Donegal also had big wins against London at home and Wicklow away, a first ever win over the men from the Garden County. They also beat Mayo away.

The only game they lost was at home to Derry. The Oak Leaf men went on to beat Sligo in the league final and will play the Allianz Division 2 A league next season.

After a highest ever finish in 2B Donegal again began the Nicky Rackard Cup championship race as one of the favourites but defeat to the late Damian Casey powered Tyrone, in Carrickmore, and a high scoring draw with Roscommon, in O'Donnell Park, saw them miss out on a place in the Nicky Rackard final. The Nicky Rackard Cup was run on a league basis this season with the top two teams playing in the final. Wins over Fermanagh, Armagh and Warwickshire and the draw with Roscommon, Donegal ended the league series on seven points. That was one behind Tyrone who went to beat Roscommon in the final.

2022 may go down as a year so near and yet so far a top two finish in Division 2 B and a whisker away from a first league final has been a huge positive. Donegal are now firmly established as a Division 2 B having played in six of the last eight 2 B campaigns since promoted from Division 3 A in 2014. It is now a matter of building on that and the next target has to step up to Division 2 A.

Stair - CLG an Beart

Hurling in Burt is older than the GAA itself. The club affiliated with the GAA in 1887, making it the oldest club in Donegal and one of the oldest clubs in continuous existence in the country.

How hurling was introduced here has been lost to the mists of time, but oral accounts speak of hurling, or camán as it was called in Burt, being played in the area in the middle of the 19th century.

Played with a thin, curved stick, predominantly in the winter months, camán was more akin to the Scottish game of shinty than modern hurling with its flat stick and summer season.

The game was played from 'deek to deek' (ditch-to-ditch) and the Burt men were sufficiently proficient to win the Ulster senior hurling championship in 1906, with the famous Hibernians team beating a County Antrim select team by 5-21 to 0-1 at a pitch in Mulleny, Burt, known as the Blue Clay Deek. It's the only Ulster senior championship final ever to have been played on Donegal soil.

The administration of Gaelic games in Donegal was weak in the early years of the 20th century, and Burt played under the Derry county board in the 1920s and 1930s, winning the senior hurling championship in 1930 and 1931, and making it a double by also winning the Derry senior football championship in '31.

The practice of playing across county boundaries was outlawed by Croke Park by the mid-1930s. Naturally, some in Burt defied the edict and continued to play in Derry in a team called the Sons of Erin, but the practice died out before the decade was done.

By the mid-1930s, Burt was fully immersed in Gaelic games in Donegal, but the 1940s were tough with emigration taking a toll and wartime rationing making travel within the county difficult. The club survived some lean years and by the 1950s were finding their feet again winning the Donegal SHC in 1952 and winning

three-in-a-row from 1955-57.

The 1960s saw even greater success for Burt within Donegal, and in 1963, three of our best ever hurlers, James McLaughlin, Danny Gallagher and the late Pearse Callaghan, were selected for the Ulster Railway Cup team that played Munster in Croke Park. James McLaughlin represented Ulster seven years running in the Railway Cup in the 1960s, a singular achievement for any Donegal hurler.

Juvenile teams had arisen sporadically over the years, but from the mid-1970s under-age teams were put on a solid footing with cousins James McLaughlin and Danny Dowds establishing hurling and football teams respectively and the club hasn't looked back since.

The 1980s saw us win two senior hurling titles and the adult football team enter the all-county leagues for the first time.

In 1991, Burt beat parish rivals Naomh Mura in the county final and embarked on a remarkable run of 16 consecutive Donegal senior hurling championship wins, and 22 titles in all over the next quarter of a century down to 2015. They claimed provincial honours too, namely the Ulster Shield (for the senior county champions from counties outside Antrim, Down and Derry) in 2001 and the Ulster Junior club championship in 2011.

In 2011, Burt club won its first Donegal football title when they defeated Lifford in the Junior A final and five years later won its first Intermediate football championship, defeating Milford after a replay.

Today, 135 years after joining the GAA, the club has around 500 adult and youth members drawn from the parish of Burt, Inch and Fahan.

We field teams in football and hurling at all grades from U7 to senior. In recent years, we have entered teams in camogie and ladies Gaelic football and that continues to expand.
