Gaelic football begins a new and exciting journey with the arrival of the Tailteann Cup.

Similar to the split season I am confident that players and supporters will respond to the increased competitiveness which it will achieve.

For six years the Sam Maguire Cup was in the hands of a Dublin team that created history. Last summer saw that run firmly ended by Mayo, who were then eclipsed by an inspired Tyrone side now cherishing their custody of the famous chalice. The drama and excitement of the recent Allianz Leagues has shown that there is a long list of serious contenders capable of stepping up to challenge the Red Hand county's grip of that prize. The result is that in both codes there is so much for us all to savour.

Since our very first days the relationship between the GAA and the media has been an important symbiotic one and I wish to acknowledge the assistance we receive from the various media outlets and platforms at enabling us to tell our story and celebrate our great games and the exceptional players who play them.

Of course, the focus of the GAA and our members does not fall on the Liam MacCarthy and Sam Maguire competitions alone.

The commencement of the Tailteann Cup is an addition to a stable that already includes the Joe McDonagh, Christy Ring, Nickey Rackard and Lory Meagher competitions.

We acknowledge and thank you for the coverage afforded to our games and activities all year round and look forward to the same profiling of our games in the weeks and months ahead.

I hope you find the information contained herein useful over the course of the season and the Communications Department at Croke Park and our network of county Communications Officers will endeavour to assist you as required over the course of the championships.

2022 Championship Formats



HURLING

The Liam MacCarthy Cup will begin with the Munster and Leinster championships with five teams in Munster and six teams in Leinster played on a round-robin basis.

The top two teams at the end of the round-robin phase will play in the provincial final. The provincial champions will progress to an All-Ireland semi-final.

Where two teams in the round robin phase are level on points the head-to-head result between them will determine their group place. If this does not apply due to a draw in that game or if more than two teams are tied on points, scoring difference will determine their league place.

The bottom-placed team in the Leinster Championship "Round-Robin" shall be relegated to the Joe McDonagh Cup. Exception, If Ciarraí wins the Joe McDonagh Cup, it shall playoff against the bottom team in the Munster Championship "Round Robin" at a neutral Munster venue determined by the CCCC. The loser of that playoff game shall be relegated to the Joe McDonagh Cup. In that circumstance, the bottom team in the Leinster Championship "Round Robin" shall not be relegated.

The third-placed team in the Leinster & Munster group shall play off against the Joe McDonagh Winner & Runner-up in the Preliminary Quarter-Finals; Winner Joe McDonagh Cup v 3rd-Placed Team Munster Group Runner-Up Joe McDonagh Cup v 3rd-Placed Team Leinster Group

The Provincial Runner-up shall play a Preliminary Quarter-Finals winner in the Quarter-Final; Leinster Runner-Up v Winner Joe McDonagh Cup/3rd Placed Munster Group Munster Runner-Up v Runner-Up Joe McDonagh Cup/3rd Placed Leinster Group

The winners will progress to the semi-finals to play a provincial champion, The Semi-Finals will be subject to the respective Provincial Champions not meeting the defeated finalists from their province at this stage and, where feasible, the avoidance of repeat pairings, a draw shall be made to determine pairings."

The All-Ireland final will take place on July 17th.

In the round robin phase of the provincial hurling championship, matches that end in a draw will result in each team receiving one point. A winning team gets two points.

In all knock-out games extra-time of two periods of 10 minutes will be required. In all games up to and including All-Ireland semi-finals if teams are still level after the 90 minutes, then a penalty taking competition will be required to determine the winner.

The only exception will be in the All-Ireland final where if teams are level after extra-time there is a replay. In the replay there will be extra-time and penalties if required.



2022 Championship Formats



FOOTBALL

The Senior Football Championship will begin in April with the four provincial championships played on a straight knockout basis, with beaten teams taking part in Sam Maguire qualifiers or the Tailteann Cup.

The Sam Maguire Cup in 2022 will be contested by the teams that are ranked as Division 1 and Division 2 teams at the end of the 2022 Allianz league. This means the two promoted teams from D3 are regraded as up and replace the two teams who have been relegated from D2.

The teams ranked as D3 and D4 at the end of the Allianz League will compete in the new Tailteann Cup.

However, a team from D3 or D4 that reaches their provincial final will be eligible to play in Sam Maguire.

In the Sam Maguire Cup if one of the D3 or D4 teams reaches a provincial final it will require a Preliminary Round Game to reduce numbers to 16. The Preliminary Round shall be confined to Counties that have not qualified for their Provincial Championship Semi-Finals in the Competition Year. Byes are permitted in the Preliminary Round Draw where an uneven number of teams are involved.

Round 1 of the Sam Maguire qualifiers will be four games involving eight teams. An Open Draw shall be made to determine the pairings, with the first team drawn having home venue.

Round 2 will feature the four winners from round 1 against one of the provincial runners-up. An open draw shall be made to determine the pairings. Venues for Round 2 shall be determined by the CCCC.

All-Ireland Quarter-finals will feature the Round 2 winners against the Provincial champions. Draw is Subject to Provincial Final Winners avoiding defeated finalists from their own Province in this Round and to the avoidance of repeat pairings where possible. Venues for Quarter-Finals shall be determined by the Central Competitions Control Committee. All-Ireland semi-finals will be Munster v Leinster (or the qualifier teams that beat them) and Connacht v Ulster (or the qualifier teams that beat them).

The All-Ireland SFC final will be played at Croke Park on July 24th.

In all games extra-time of two periods of 10 minutes will be required. In all games up to and including All-Ireland semi-finals if teams are still level after extra-time, then a penalty taking competition will be required to determine the winner.

The only exception will be in the All-Ireland final where if teams are level after extra-time there is a replay. In the replay there will be extra-time and penalties if required.

In the Tailteann Cup teams will be divided by CCCC into a North Group and a South Group. New York will enter the competition at the quarter-final stage with their game played in Ireland.

There will be an open draw to determine a preliminary round if there are more than 16 teams involved.

The Tailteann Cup is played as a straight knockout competition.

The Tailteann Cup semi-finals will be stand-alone fixtures with live tv on Sunday June 19th. The Tailteann Cup final will be played in Croke Park on July 9th along with a Sam Maguire Semi-Final.

In all games, extra-time of two periods of 10 minutes will be required. In all games up to and including All-Ireland finals if teams are still level after extra-time, then a penalty taking competition will be required to determine the winner.



2022 Hurling Media Guide - Plenty of Challengers

When Limerick dismantled Cork in last year's All-Ireland Final to make it three Liam MacCarthy Cups in four years, their dominance of the game looked more pronounced than ever.

And when you considered the age profile as well as quality of their panel combined with the excellence of their management brains trust, it was easy to look towards the 2022 All-Ireland Championship with green-tinted glasses.

And now? Well, it's not looking so cut and dried any more, is it?

Limerick's Allianz League campaign was a subdued one that saw them display an unfamiliar vulnerability as they were beaten three times, including a heavy nine-point defeat to Cork.

What stood out most about that match was just how second-best Limerick were in terms of the metric they usually score highest in – work rate.

It was very unusual to see them so comprehensively out-hustled and out-fought by Cork in the physical exchanges and made you wonder if perhaps the success of the last four years had sated appetites somewhat.

It'll be no surprise if Limerick are a very different beast when they play Cork in the first round of the Munster SHC round-robin on April 17, but we can only judge them on what we've seen so far this year and there will be a couple of areas of concern for manager John Kiely.

Until they cut loose in their final match of the campaign against Offaly, they'd only scored two goals in four matches and don't seem to have the same cutting edge without the injured Peter Casey to call on. In his absence, a lot of responsibility will rest on Aaron Gillane's shoulders to get back to his very best form.

If Limerick have regressed slightly, then who is best placed to knock them from their perch? The obvious answer is a Waterford team that looked sensational at times when cutting through Cork in the Allianz Hurling League Final.

Liam Cahill's well-drilled team look to have everything they need to go all the way this year. Serious depth, a voracious work-ethic, and a forward line that is now consistently going for the jugular as evidenced by the 22 goals they scored in their successful league campaign.

As for the other contenders, Cork and Kilkenny probably look the next best placed to mount serious challenges in this year's championship.

Their heavy defeat to Waterford in that league final does raise some doubts about Cork's mettle again, but until that match they'd played with an impressive physical intensity and defensive organisation to complement the skill and speed in attack that was already there.

Having just one home match in Munster will be a disadvantage, but if they can hit the ground running in the first round against Limerick then Cork's talented young team could really take off.

Kilkenny will take lots of positives from the league, most especially Pádraig Walsh's successful relocation to the forwards and the form of young players like David Blanchfield, Mikey Butler and Cian Kenny.

Centre-back remains something of a problem position, but if Paddy Deegan can nail down that defensive pivot then the Cats will really start looking like a potent team.

Wexford were the most improved team in the country until they were taken apart by Waterford in the league semi-final. It looked like Lee Chin suffered a recurrence of his hamstring injury in that match too and if he's missing for their opening match against Galway it'll be a big blow.

As for the Tribesmen, they look like a team in transition under new manager Henry Shefflin as do Tipperary under Colm Bonnar. You would never write off either county, but on the basis of what we've seen so far this year they both look some way off the standard that was set by Waterford.

Dublin had a solid league campaign but lack a little bit of magic in attack, while Clare have plenty of firepower but perhaps not the defensive solidity to complement it.

Momentum is key in the round-robin phase, so a good start will be half the battle for all concerned.

JOE MCDONAGH CUP

Antrim look like the team to beat in the Joe McDonagh Cup this year after an encouraging Allianz Hurling League Division 1 campaign that saw them stay up by beating another McDonagh Cup competitor, Offaly.

As well as that win Antrim were also extremely competitive against Waterford, Kilkenny, Dublin, and Laois and if they can bring the same consistency of performance into the Championship should be well-placed to lift some silverware, with Offaly and Carlow arguably their two biggest rivals.

CHRISTY RING CUP

Last year's beaten Christy Ring Cup finalists, Derry, look like a team on a mission to go one further this year. They were very impressive winners of Division 2B of the Allianz Hurling League this year winning all six of their matches. Their biggest challengers in the Christy Ring Cup this year is likely to be Kildare. The Lilywhites operated in Division 2A of the Allianz Hurling League this year so they're used to a higher level of competition.

NICKEY RACKARD CUP

It's 100 years since the birth of Nickey Rackard, and the Cup that honours him should be a very competitive one this year. 2020 champions Donegal have arguably the best pedigree, but Tyrone looked strong when winning Division 3A of the Allianz Hurling League this year.

LORY MEAGHER CUP

Monaghan and Louth are the two highest ranked league teams in the Lory Meagher Cup this year and will start the competition as favourites, but keep an eye out too for a Longford team that showed good form when reaching the Division 3B League Final. Lancashire are dark horses too.

JOE McDONAGH CUP

FORMAT

- The Joe McDonagh Cup shall have Six Teams in its Championship and shall be played on a Round-Robin basis.
- Each County shall have three home games and two away games which shall rotate every other year.
- The counties who finish in the top two places shall qualify for the final.
- The winner of the final if a non-Munster team, shall be promoted to the Leinster Championship. If Ciarraí wins the Joe McDonagh Cup, it shall playoff against the bottom team in the Munster Championship "Round Robin" at a neutral Munster Venue determined by the CCCC. The loser of that playoff game shall be relegated to the Joe McDonagh Cup. In that circumstance, the bottom team in the Leinster Championship "Round Robin" shall not be relegated.
- The bottom-placed team in the "Round-Robin" shall be relegated to the Christy Ring Cup.





2022 GAA Media Guide - A Festival of Football is Imminent

For much of the past decade the format of the All-Ireland SFC has dominated the agenda. Debates and motions have been discussed at length, but on the eve of the 2022 Championship several counties quietly believe that success can be attained in the coming weeks.

A new schedule with the Tailteann Cup in operation means that progress can be made: hoisting silverware is a possibility.

Six years ago, Dermot Earley, then the GPA's chief executive, stood in the GAA museum surrounded by a string of reporters talking about the latest proposed solution to help remedy format and fixture issues.

During the course of the interview Earley acknowledged the relevance of tradition and the difficulties encountered in changing minds and approaches.

"I think an inter-county player, with the time that it takes from your personal life to be a player at that level, I think everybody deserves their shot at the top," Earley said. "Growing up as footballers, from the first time you kicked a ball, it was all about winning Sam Maguire and that's what I think is probably important."

An opportunity still exists to take a scalp and a run through the provincial championships for division three and four teams could lead to a place in the All-Ireland race.

A number of established counties will be striving to reach the latter stages as the Allianz Football League supplied ample evidence of Kerry's ability and the enduring class of David Clifford.

At the end of his acceptance speech, as Croke Park emptied, Clifford acknowledged the fact that another tussle involving Kerry and Mayo could well transpire. "No doubt we will be meeting you again," Clifford suggested.



Before that Kerry will want to produce in Munster. A May meeting awaits against Cork, while Limerick, Tipperary, and Clare, still passionate and purposeful, will all feel that 2022 could end on a positive note.

The nature of the Kerry loss meant the league finished on a disappointing note for Mayo, but nonetheless the previous seven matches offered encouragement for the green and red. James Horan experimented, but still won four encounters and drew one in a highly competitive environment.

Cillian O'Connor's return as a substitute in the league decider offered a crumb of comfort ahead of an eagerly anticipated Castlebar clash against Galway on April 24.

Roscommon's unbeaten Division Two campaign is a real boost for Anthony Cunningham's charges, who want to make an impact out west.

It promises to be typically competitive and hard fought in Ulster. In the league All-Ireland champions Tyrone did what was required to avoid relegation. Fergal Logan and Brian Dooher had Tyrone primed last year and that should certainly be the case once more in 2022.

Monaghan, with Jack McCarron in splendid form, defeated Dublin in a dramatic last round. After the match the locals celebrated gleefully at St Tiernach's Park, another chapter in the Monaghan football story added. Séamus 'Banty' McEnaney, ever the competitor, will want Monaghan to flourish on the Ulster stage.

Armagh enjoyed a productive return to the top tier too with Rian O'Neill showcasing his skill. Declan Bonner's Donegal and Cavan, who claimed Division Four glory, will have similar intentions.

In 2023 Dublin will play in Division Two, but before then Dessie Farrell will be adamant that a summer adventure can occur.

Transition is a dreaded word in elite sport, but the fact that so many decorated figures have departed the inter-county scene in recent years means Dublin have to reinvent themselves.

There is still an abundance of class in the Dublin panel and edgy championship matches at GAA headquarters might precisely be the place to illustrate their pedigree.

Can Meath and Kildare make a bid for Leinster honours? Mickey Harte's Louth, prompted by the brilliant Sam Mulroy, have claimed back-to-back promotions in league fare. Will further progress be made in the next few months?

The Tailteann Cup affords others an opportunity to dream. Perhaps that captures what sport is all about: the thought that better days await a team or a county.

Now a real chance to stitch a winning run together ensures counties are hopeful. Michael Maher's effective work with London was one of the tales of the league, especially the stirring start following two disrupted years.

Momentum can be generated and it will be fascinating to see how some of the journeys unfold in that competition. April, May, June, and July will be action packed. A festival of football is imminent.

Ferguson Archive

In late 2021 the GAA embarked on a project to provide an updated results and statistics archive for Gaelic games.

In its absence at national level, the Association acknowledges the work of numerous individuals who have preserved records on our behalf throughout our history. Sadly many of these pioneers like Raymond Smith, Mick Dunne, Tom Ryall and Owen McCann to name only a few are no longer with us. Thankfully their work has endured and inspired many others to whom the GAA remains enormously grateful for their diligence and care of records at local and national level.

The GAA's statistics project was given a significant boost when we received the co-operation of Sligo's Pádraig Ferguson, who since the 1980s has been assembling his GAA statistics database and has been making his work known on the GAA Lore platform.

A sample of his statistics are listed here and it is our intention to update and house the archive as part of the redeveloped gaa.ie website later this year.
