Ground Regulations

- 04. The unauthorized climbing of any structure, walls or buildings in this ground strictly forbidden.
- 05. Unnecessary noise from the use of radio sets, gas-horns and behaviour likely to cause confusion Of nuisance of any kind, including foul or abusive language, is not permitted in any part of the ground.

- Under no circumstances is it permitted to throw any object the pitch.
- 07. Unauthorised persons are not permitted to enter upon the field of play.
- 08. Any person who fails to comply with the instruction from a Garda or Steward may be ejected from the ground.
- 09. In general, the right of admission is reserved to the Ground Management.
- The Ground Management reserves the right to refuse admission to or eject any person who refuses to be searched by a member of the Garda Siochana.
- Any person who remains in or obstructs a gangway or circulation area may be ejected from the ground.
- 12. The Ground Management reserve the right for it's servants or agents to remove from the ground any person who does not comply with the Ground Regulations or whose presence in the ground could reasonably be construed as constituting a source of danger, nuisance or annoyance to other spectators.

Dungloe GAA Club was founded in 1923. Between 1928 & 1931 the Club contested no more than 3 Senior League finals. In 1929 Dungloe won the league (Democrat Cup) and the year after secured the Dr Maguire Cup. Back to back Senior Football Championships were won in 1930 & 1931. Another in 1933 & 1936 with title number 5 in 1940. A wait of 17 years and it was back to back Senior Football Championship titles again in 1957 & 1958. Senior league titles were also won in 1956, 1961 & 1962. The first U-14 Championship was played in 1962 & Dungloe secured the title in 1963 & 1966. U-16 titles were won in 1965 & 1981 with the first Minor Title arriving in 1949, another in 1956 and the three in a row in 1966,67 &68.

Since the Club's reformation in 1981 we have gone from strength to strength both on & off the playing field.

A Junior B title in 1983 got the club back to winning ways. A Donegal Comortos Peile na Gaeltacht Soisir title in 1984 set the wheels in motion and 1986 proved to be a very successful year for the club. The decision was taken to step up to Intermediate Championship without winning a Junior A Championship and this brought more silverware to the Club. An Intermediate Chamionship, Donegal Junior Comortos Peile na Gaeltachta title, All Ireland Junior Comortos Peile na Gaeltachta title, Pormotion to Division 2 & a Division 2 shield final appearance.

The Club is fielding more teams than ever from U-6 to Senior level in boys, girls, ladies & men's football and hurling and 2021 an underage Camoige team took the field. At senior level the club won the 1995 Reserve Championship final, reached the 1996 Reserve Championship semi final, a Senior Reserve Championship win in 2009 & in 2014 a Senior Championship Reserve Final appearance once again only to be defeated in a replay by St Eunans. The Democrat Cup came to town in 1996 again. Another Senior league title in 2001. A Division 2 league title was won in 2015 and in 2016 the Senior & Reserve teams reached the guarter final of the Donegal Senior Championship. Donegal & All Ireland Senior Comortos Peile na Gaeltachta titles were won in 2001. Donegal Comortos Peile na Gaeltachta senior title 2010. The club is also going from strength at Ladies Football from underage through to Senior Ladies. We also field Camogie teams and Hurling is nurtured from underage.

Representation on County Teams has always been a part of Dungloe GAA Club's history down through the year at all levels and at school levels. CLG An CLochan Liath are proud to be home to County, Ulster & All Ireland medal winners from underage, 21 & senior level and of our 2 All Star's Tony Boyle 1992 & Adrian Sweeney 2003.

On the Cultural side the Club are annual participants in both Scor na nÓg and Scor Sinsir, with many county titles & ulster titles bestowed on our competitors along with representations at All Ireland Level. We are proud also this year to have a Club Oige trí Gaeilge for our young people in the area.

A special evening in Sept 2014 CLG An Clochán Liath opened our new Club House after many years of planning, fund raising, late night meetings and negotiations the dream and graft of those gone before came to fruition.

Over the years emigration knocked on the door of our club and while we were sad to see our players go we are proud to say that many of those who moved on have won honours with Club & County Teams at home and abroad. Our diaspora still follow the day to day activities of our club through the many new media facilities now available and most tune in to the streaming of the games and kick every ball with their fellow team mates and friends.

With a greater amount of activity both on and off the field in CLG An Clochán Liath we look forward to the future as we remember the game is not all about winning and we hope to add many more lasting friendships to those we have gained over the years since the foundation of our club.

The end of a long road for Dungloe & Naomh Columba

Dungloe and Naomh Columba, today's intermediate championship finalists, will be hoping to bring an end to a long road back to championship glory this afternoon.


It has been three-score and six years since Dungloe won their one and only Intermediate championship crown. The Rosses club, and seven time senior

championship winners, captured their one and only Intermediate championship title back in 1986. Naomh Columba are bidding for a first Intermediate crown in only their second ever Intermediate final appearance. Their one and only other final was back in 2011 when they lost to St Nauls.

Dungloe have taken it game by game on their way to today's final. Last year's beaten finalist, they were paired with Burt, Gaeil Fhanada, Malin and Naomh Muire Lower Rosses, when the draw was made. With Burt and Malin away plus Gaeil Fhánadá and Naomh Muire at home it was a tricky enough group. Burt swept all before on their way to winning the McGlynns' Restaurant Division Three of the All-County league. Malin lost just once in Marley Travel Division Two and were promoted to Brian McCormick Sports Division One while Gaeil Fhánadá had won the All-Ireland Junior championship, Naomh Muire had clinched promotion from Division Three to Division Two and to make it even spicier it was a local derby like all local derbies games between Dungloe and the Rosses' neighbours take on a life of its own.

It proved a surmountable challenge for Dungloe. They opened with a win over Burt in Hibernian Park and followed that success up with wins over





It has been a long and windy road back to the Intermediate final for Naomh Columba. Kevin McNern is one of six surviving members of the 2011 team

that lost to St Nauls - the other five are Kevin's brother Ryan McNern, Declan Maguire, Oisin McGinley, Barry Carr and Ciaran McBrearty. Kevin is well up for Saturday's challenge - "we have been trying ever since and this is the first year to get back to the final. It has been a long eleven years. It has been a long road with a lot of near misses and misfortune along the way. It just goes to show that it is never easy to get to a final. We've come up short in a lot of semi-finals over the last few years and it is becoming a bit of a habit. I suppose that is why we were happy to get over the line against Fanad, in the semi-final because it had become a bit of a monkey off the back really".



Naomh Columba were in a group along with Naomh Brid, Convoy, Downings and Buncrana.

They won three and lost one with a heavy defeat to Na Dubaibh in Downings. They brushed aside Buncrana, in the quarter-final and saw off Gaeil Fhánadá, in the semi-final to book their place in O'Donnell Park this afternoon.

It promises to be an intriguing final between two road tested squads, each determined to make it back to Senior Championship football a place where both clubs will feel they belong.

When a group of men gathered in March 1924 with a view to forming a GAA club, little did they imagine the impact that this would have on the parish of Glencolmcille that resonates to this day. The club they founded continued until the 40's when emigration took its toll on playing numbers and for the next two decades players turned out for Kilcar.

In 1964 with numbers again on the rise, it was decided to reform the club and this proved successful as two U-14 titles were claimed before the decade was out.

In the early years of the 70's progress of the senior team was steady, with trips to the Junior finals of 1972 and 1973 before an historic first adult trophy in the 1974 Junior championship win against Falcarragh. With this win the club were promoted to the senior grade. Now the question was, would they be able to compete at this level? This was answered by claiming the senior league in 1976, the first of seven the club have won to date.

The first senior county final was reached and won in 1978, but we had to wait another twelve years for the second Dr Maguire to arrive across Carrick Bridge. Silverware did come in the shape of

underage titles with wins from U-21, minor, U-16 and U-14. 1992 saw a ladies board formed in the club and it did not take long to flourish, at present we have six ladies teams at various levels.

Numerous players from the club have had the honour of representing various county teams, from Finian Ward who won an Ulster medal in 1974 to Aaron Doherty who is currently on the county senior team. The 20th September 1992 was one of the proudest days for the club when two of our finest, John Joe Doherty and Noel Hegarty, played key roles in bringing the Sam Maguire to the Hills for the first time.

The last decade has seen yet more success at underage level, which has a massive bearing on having two teams competing in both of today's finals (this also happened in 1998, with the club in both the senior and senior reserve finals).

Ninety-eight years on from that first meeting, Naomh Columba plays such an integral role in the parish of Glencolmcille, especially on its youth and hopefully we can go from strength to strength for at least another ninety eight years!

Stair - Naomh Mhuire, Conmhaigh

St Mary's GAA club was formed in 1928. The founder members were Tommy McNamee, Paddy McPeake, Jim McCarrick, Joe O'Donnell, William O'Keefe, Arthur and Wille McGlinchey and Paddy Hoey. It started from a seven-a-side tournament in Raphoe. Convoy entered a team and then decided to form a club. The first meeting was held behind the old chapel wall as there was no hall available, Tommy McNamee was the first Secretary/ Treasurer and after about six months Paddy Hoey took over these positions.

To raise funds the club decided to run a whist drive and Toal Shiels, who lived in the corner house and owned what was known as "The Bandplace" (the room where the old AOH Band used to practice) was where the first ever whist drive was held in the area. Toal Shiels made the tables for it ouy of tea-chest lids. The players contributed to the cost of travelling to matches on a Sunday. The first field Convoy ever played in belonged to the late Francie Gallagher up in the Heatherly Hill. They spent some time there and then changed to the field belonging to Mary Ann McKelvey, down the lane to where the McKelveys lived. The club had a field from Andy McNamee at Ballyboe. They played there for a few years from 1948 and then returned to Jerry McCafferty's field about 1953. Subsequently they moved three times - to a field at Maguire's pub in Killyknure, then Phonsie Kelly's field at Heatherly Hill and in later years they moved to Terence McKinley's field in Figard. Jerry or Jim McCafferty always provided a field for the club as well.

From the outset the club concentrated on underage players and many of them played senior football at an early age, as young as 14 in some cases – the likes of the late Eddie Toner, known as Big Eddie, James O'Donnell, the Harkins, the Gallaghers and Willie Sweeney. The Club's first success was in 1939/40 when they won the Junior Championship two years in succession. In 1943 they went to the Senior final but lost to Ballyshannon. At that time the club had some Killygordon players – Sarsh McLoughlin, Peter McGowan and Kevin Gallen. Six weeks after the County final Convoy beat Ballyshannon by a point in the Democrat Cup in a gale force wind. They played Down Strands in the final in Drumboe and in the same year lost to the 17th Battallion in the Feis Cup final.

No success came Convoy's way again until 1963 when they won the Junior championship and the League, moving to the Senior Grade in 1964. In 1995 Convoy won the Junior championship, defeating Robert Emmets in the final in Ballybofey. In the intervening years the club had much success with their under-age players winning the u-14 Championship two years in succession – 1969 and 1970, an u-14B title in 1990, u-12B in 1991 and 1993 and reaching the finals of the u-14B and u-21B in 1993.

From very modest beginnings the club now have their own playing ground and club house. They also had the honour of one of the club founders – the late Paddy Hoey, being elected chairman of the County Board in 1969/70 and in 1977 the club had two of its members elected as county officers – Charlie Kavanagh as

secretary and Danny Harkin as Treasurer.

Following Junior Adult championship glory in 1995 Convoy were promoted to Div 3 in 1996, remaining there for two years before being relegated. The club played played Division 4 football for 19 years and eventually got promotion to Division 3 for the 2018 season.

2005 was a busy year for the club winning the Junior A championship defeating our near neighbours Naomh Pádraig Lifford in the final in MacCumhaill Park. This was also the year St Mary's Convoy opened their refurbished sand based pitch, in May. Donegal played Mayo at the official opening which was performed by Peter Quinn, a former President of the GAA. We also had a very successful draw that year to help part pay for same. In the following years our facilities were used by Donegal teams for training purposes from minor to senior level. In 2011 we installed flood lighting on our main pitch and as a consequence of this we have hosted many high profile games. A part of an episode of the TV programme the Toughest Trade featuring the Welsh rugby player Shane Williams was filmed there in January 2017

In 2012, St Mary's Convoy won both the County Minor Division 2 and the Under 21B County championships. For a number of years Convoy had problems fielding a Reserve team but thankfully for the last number of years there has been considerable success at this level winning the Reserve Div 4 league on four occasions between 2013 and 2017. Convoy also won the Division 3 reserve league at their first attempt in 2018. There was also success at this level in the Reserve B championship in 2017. Convoy have competed in and on some occasions have achieved success in competitions at other under age levels. We have had a number of players who have represented at all age groups.

In 2008 the Ladies section of our club was formed and this has gone from strength to strength. They won the Junior Championship in 2010 followed by success in the Intermediate grade the following year. Convoy currently have Ladie's teams competing at all grades. Again we have had a number of players who have represented at all age groups. We have had the privilege of hosting the Donegal Ladies senior final on a number of occasions. Gaelic for mothers and others was set up in 2010 with local mums and ladies who train training once a week. They take part in the Ulster blitz and the All Ireland blitz in Dublin once a year and a few local friendly games throughout the year

St Mary's Convoy have had good committees down the years who have worked very hard to keep theirr club running successfully with good nights at Strictly Come Dancing, Fight Nights etc. All good fun and lucrative as well. In the last 3 years St Mary's have done very well in the National Draw being the top sellers in the Country for this year 2019 and joint top last year.

St Mary's Convoy is a vibrant club who hope to expand both on and off the playing fields in the years ahead.


